MAINTENANCE & CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT UPDATES ON SACRED HEART PARISH BUILDINGS

During the summer, a new heating system, replacing the original system from 1960, was installed in Sacred Heart School. The cost of the new system was \$45,378. At that time, Scott Martin of Scott Martin Services evaluated the heating system in Sacred Heart Church and advised us to change that system also because only half of the boiler for the church was functional; and if we rebuilt the non-functional half, we had no guarantee that the remaining half would not break down. Therefore, within the next three weeks we will be replacing the heating system in Sacred Heart Church, at a cost of \$35,976. These capital improvements to both buildings have been long overdue. If there were greater funds, we would also have replaced the entire piping system within the church, but the cost would be prohibitive. After consultation with several people in the field, it was deemed that just replacing the boiler would be the best way to go at this time. Please note that during this transition of systems there may be days when there will be no heat in the church so please come to Mass prepared with either a sweater or coat. Scott Martin tells us that the project itself, once up and running, will take six to seven days to complete. Thank you for your understanding.

As October is coming to an end, I want to remind you that every year in November we are asked to prayerfully consider supporting vocations to the Priesthood and Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary by making a donation through the **Annual Seminary Appeal**. There are few needs more important than vocations to the Priesthood, and the continual support from you and the other faithful of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia is essential to the future of the Church.

Seminarians today arrive at the Seminary with very different needs than in the past, and the most significant reality is that the Priestly Life is more counter-cultural than ever in recent history. Almost all of our seminarians that graduate become parish priests to serve you, your children and grandchildren by celebrating the Eucharist, baptizing, hearing confessions, officiating at weddings and providing the consolation and comfort of the sacraments to the sick and dying. I can assure you, parish priests are not in ministry for the money, and if seminarians were expected to pay for all of their own education and formation expenses, than there would be far fewer vocations.

You and the lay faithful can make a difference in the lives of our seminarians, our community, and the broader Church by your support of the **Seminary Appeal**. Today's seminarians undergo extensive training in intellectual, human, spiritual and pastoral ministries formation. They have a zeal for sharing the truth of Salvation History with everyone they meet, and they have a love for the Church and a spirit for friendship with other young adults. With your prayers, encouragement and financial support you provide the opportunity to educate, train and prepare priests for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, as well as mission dioceses throughout the world. CARDINAL RIGALI TO HOST CONFERENCE ON ADDICTIONS

On Friday, November 5, 2010, a one-day Conference on Addictions is being hosted by His Eminence Cardinal Justin Rigali at the Sheraton Philadelphia City Center Hotel. The conference will focus on the importance of integrating professional therapy, spiritual support groups, pastoral care and sacramental ministry for addicted individuals and their families. Prevention, early intervention, treatment and recovery will be addressed as related to substance abuse, alcoholism, sexual addictions and internet-based addictive behaviors. Cardinal Rigali will deliver opening remarks, based on his recent book on the topic, "Let the Oppressed Go Free: Breaking the Bonds of Addiction," published by Basilica Press.
