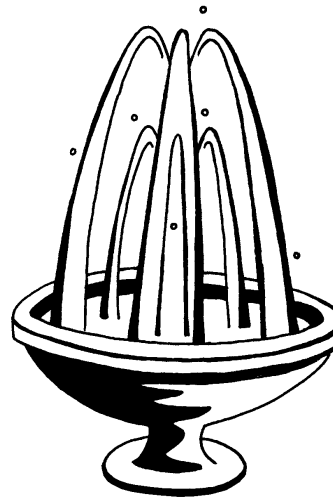

PARISH JOINT PASTORAL COUNCIL
OCTOBER 11, 2010 MEETING SUMMARY**

The Sacred Heart and Holy Trinity Joint Pastoral Council met on Monday, October 11, 2010. Council members are: Lenora Francis, Pat Horne, George Miskewicz, Jr., Barbara Mock, David Moore, Marcy Power, Denise Pristash, Sister Louise Quinn, Joseph Rakowski, Henry Rodrique, Father Michael Rzonca (Pastor and Chair), Roseanne Taylor (Vice Chair), Cathy Varady (Recording Secretary), and JoAnn Yusko.

Father Mike's Report

- Father Mike was very pleased with the Sacred Heart Parish 110th Anniversary Celebration on September 24th at Franklin Commons. It was something different with a new venue for our parishioners and friends to gather. It was a positive and fun evening for all in attendance. Father Mike was extremely grateful to those on the planning committee who contributed to the success of the evening.
- The International Montessori School leasing Sacred Heart School is trying to increase their enrollment.
- If the Phoenixville Area School District is not going to continue their lease of Holy Trinity School for next school year, they will soon give us notice.
- Father Mike and his staff are currently working on the Christmas Mass schedule.
- The heating system in Sacred Heart Church was evaluated by Scott A. Martin Services, Inc. Half of the system was not functioning; and if rebuilt, there was no guarantee that the remaining half would not break down. Within the next few weeks, the heating system will be replaced.

- A Bible Study Group will be offered in Advent during the daytime. The day of the week and time need to be determined.

Old Business

- The Sacred Heart Parish 110th Anniversary Celebration made over \$17,000. A final amount will be reported later. A problem was encountered with the authenticity of some of the sports' memorabilia provided by LT Sports. All the sports' items in question were recalled and the winning bidders reimbursed.
- Pat Horne and Lenora Francis reported that only four people volunteered to serve on the Hospitality Committee. The role of the Hospitality/Greeters Committee is to promote a "spirit of Hospitality" by making parishioners and visitors welcome at our liturgies. In addition, from time to time, the committee will assist with hosting "Coffee and Doughnut Sunday" after Sunday morning Masses and "Saturday Get Together" after Vigil Masses. More people are needed for this committee.
- Discussions continued regarding the future of parishes in the Archdiocese and an examination of parishes to ensure that they possess what is necessary to promote effectively the mission of Christ and meeting the needs of the 21st century.
- The *Giving Tree Project* is moving forward. Members of Council will assist with the ornaments.

New Business

- Father Hutter, new pastor of St. Mary's Parish, is dealing with several building problems. One of his building problems involves St. Mary's Rectory, so Father Hutter is considering the use of Holy Trinity's rectory, which is currently vacant.
- More capital improvements at Sacred Heart and Holy Trinity need to be done—(1) A new heating system is needed in Sacred Heart Church and will be installed this fall at a cost of approximately \$36,000. (2) The stained glass windows at Sacred Heart and Holy Trinity need to be repaired and caulking replaced. Approximately \$17,000 will be needed to repair the Sacred Heart windows; and \$10,000 at Holy Trinity. (3) The wiring and sound systems in both churches will be inspected.
- The Archdiocese is doing an inspection of all parish buildings as they upgrade their insurance policies.

Next Meeting:

- The next meeting will be held on Monday, November 8, 2010, at 6:30 p.m., Sacred Heart Parish Hall.

Mass Remembrances

- Blessed Mother Altar Flower Requests - \$45 each request. Flowers are placed on the altar each week during Ordinary Time in the Liturgical Calendar, and the name is announced in our bulletin. Limit two per family to start the year.
